OVERVIEW

Anjali Jenna Teigen's ("AJ") practice encompasses a wide range of areas of IP and technology law, including patent litigation, patent prosecution, post-grant proceedings before the Patent Trial and Appeal Board (PTAB), licensing, opinions, and counselling.
